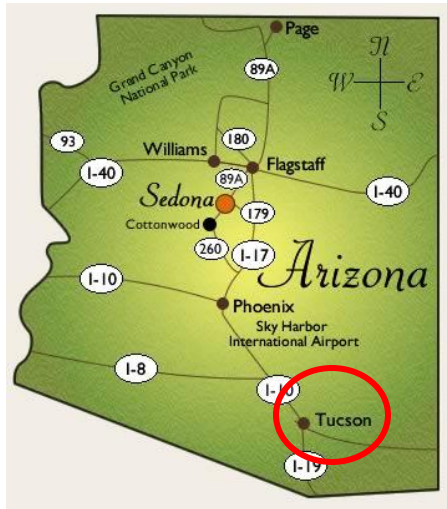


# Where is Tucson?

# What ministry is available in Tucson?

Volunteers in Arizona work mainly as educators in the Tucson area where several HM sisters are in ministry.

Two schools in or around Tucson where volunteers are placed are schools made up of a population primarily of Native American students – San Xavier Mission School (Tucson) and San Carlos (in Globe, AZ about 100 miles from Tucson)



Along with the traditional academic program, San Xavier Mission School stresses Native American culture and language. The school educates students from kindergarten through eighth grade and primarily serves Tohono O'odham children from the San Xavier District (Village of Wa:k) and surrounding areas. Since 1888, the San Xavier Mission has operated a school to serve the O'odham and is one of the oldest continuously operating schools in the State of Arizona



San Carlos schools in Globe, AZ are another volunteer site. San Carlos serves mainly, but not

exclusively, the Apache Indian population.



Another volunteer site is located in Nogales, AZ, which borders the city of Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, and is Arizona's largest international border town. Volunteers serve as teachers from elementary school through high school in the Lourdes schools. Lourdes Catholic School offers both bicultural and bilingual education and serves a large Mexican population.
